Jim Ned Indian sports had a great fall competing in cross country, volleyball, and football. All the teams advanced to compete in post-district play.

Our cross country teams had a great fall with both the boys and the girls. Our boys' team advanced to the regional meet in Lubbock after finishing 2nd place at the district meet. Our girls' team won both the district and regional meet, qualifying to run in the state meet held in Round Rock. The girls finished 4th place overall at the state meet in Round Rock.

In their third season, volleyball finished in 2nd place in the district race and made a great run in the playoffs. After defeating Comanche, Colorado City, and Wall in the playoffs they advanced to the regional tournament at Abilene Christian University. The girls finished with a 26-14 overall record.

The football team earned a spot in the state playoffs. This was the first time in six years the football team advanced to the state playoffs. With wins over Anson and Roscoe in predistrict and wins over Early, Bangs, and Merkel in district play, the boys earned a spot in the bi-district round of the playoffs.
